

Nicola Occhiofino: First of all Good morning to all of you and once again thank you for your intense participation. In this morning session, during the Second White band day of the Global Call to Action Against Poverty, we will discuss the following topic: "Against Poverty what to do now?". Paraphrasing the Russian writer, Fedor Dostoesvskij we can assert that our ideals are stronger than the so called unjust's realism, that is without values, because our choices feed on concrete projects, that we need to support with our continuous mobilisation. In this historical phase, we need to start the spring of justice and peace in the world.

To show us the way, there is a priest of poor people, already mentioned during this assembly, Don Tonino Bello, that said: "Have courage prophets of the spring, the earth not to shiver needs blankets of hope". In this direction we must work this morning, think more and then we need to act without delay.
